Jenny: Yeah.

(Is that unusual or was that common for a person to be a member of two lodges at once?)

Jenny: Now it's got to be a mighty good leader. You see, it's just like we vote. We vote for governors and senators. Well, they do that. And he was always picked from the tribe because when he's the leader, everything goes right. And that's the kind he was. An they said he was a mean man too. That nobody can't overrule him. He was strict. Everybody had to behave themselves. That's the way he want them to be. And that's how come they choose him. (The things that you know about him, how did you learn these?) Jenny: From my father. I had an aunt, that's my father's sister. They know all about it but they're gone. They died. So my father was--well, he had other soms that are well thought of but they all

(Well, now your father's name was Toomsay?)

Jenny: Sétzédlbe. And Hŵmpekw, that was his boyhood day--Hŵmpekw. When he was a boy they call him Tsáli Hŵmpekw. But they just call him Hŵmpekw. And later when he became a young man they name him Sétzédlbe--Dangerous Bear.

(And then the other one was Tsali Hwmpekw?)

Jenny: Awmpekw.

gone.

(Tsali Hwmpekw.)

Jenny: Yeah, that's his real name.

(How did he get the name of Dangerous Bear?)

Jenny: Well, that's just the name that I guess his father--when they named him Dangerous Bear, Sétzédlbe. And his own Indian name was--Grandpa's Indian name was Sétgóng'à.
