Well, it's the first road that turns west. You follow that road about five milesmaybe five or six miles. Good road all the way-all the way down there. And that'll
take you to Zena.

'(Well it must have been quite a little town. I've heard about it.)

Yeah there's two or three stores there. And I think blacksmith shop--used to be. Had a pretty good settlement there. Lot of the dwelling houses scattered around. Been quite a while since I've been down there. But they had nice stores there.

(Yeah.)

And post office -- they had a post office.

(Yes sir. And was there a place called Dennis up in there somewhere?)
Yeah. Still on further west, north and west of Zena. Not very far.

(Now, it's gone too, isn't it?)

Well, I think so. It's been'a long time since I've been down through there.

BURIAL PLACE FOR GENERAL STAND WAITIE

Now what I was going to tell you about Stand Watie, he's buried over here onnow this boy told me--his name--What is his name? But anyhow they had a farm there.

And how come me to know this, this boy worked on this uh--electric line you know.

He lives there at home. Told me, "Jess you know what, Stand Waite's--there's a
big sign on the highway down there that tells about Stand Watie where he's buried.

(Yes sir.)

And he said, "That's not so." He's not buried up there." He said, "I saw his monument over here on Grand River."

(Uh-huh)

Let's see, I think (words not clear), no that's not his name. Anyhow it's on that farm and this same fellow told me the same thing. Said, "That fellow's buried over there on our place." Right cross toward Bernice, little bit east cross that river.
