Pawhuska. And nowadays we get over there in twenty minutes; sometimes thirty minutes. That's quite different. I was... was repeating that to my daughter sometime ago. Well other things that I always tell her. Now I don't know just what else I can remember. MORE ABOUT SCHOOLS

The time came that I was mored frgh Pawhuska to Hominy. And I went to school at Hominy. At this stone building with all grades, "all went together. : I remember I went to school there and only one $I$ can remember is Josephine (Osage name). Which was Mrs. Josephine Kipp. And then a few more others I remember, as I was going to school there. Later years we came from back Claremore Camp. And our pafents brought us there in a wagon. Sometimes in a hack and there we ate lunch there at noon. At different place. Sometimes Josephine and I would gorto her grandmother's for lunch. And other times, I had place there in town. Hotel had a dining room. This hotel was called Comercial Hotel. I can remember it just as plain today as it was then. That was where I had my lunch. , And then went back to school, and then my father would come after me, after school. And-we was, it wasnyt, so far ifrom here to Claremore Camp: As it is just a little ways now. But that's where we lived at that time. I guess maybe they thought it was too far to go to Pawhuska. So I have been moved to Hominy. And that was where I was going to school at that time.
(Now do you remember your reacher's name?)
Marie:. Oh, I remember my teacher's name. It was Miss Crain. Her name was Miss Jessie Crain. Later, she married Charles B. Peters, he was Iiving in Tulsa in later years. But I had never got to see my teacher." Sometime ago, I was asking somebody about Mrs. Peters and they said, she was still living in Tulsa. So it would be nfce to see her one of these days. And I imagine she's getting quite older as I am myself.
