I can remember it just as plain today as it was then. That was where I had my lunch. And then went back to school, and then my father would come after me, after school. And we was, it wasn't so far from here to Claremore Camp. As it is just a little ways now. But that's where we lived at that time. I guess maybe they thought it was too far to go to Pawhuska. So I have been moved to Hominy. And that was where I was going to school at that time.
