(Well, you were pretty good size fellow when you came up here then. Weren't you.)

Oh, yeah. Yeah. We moved from there close to where Westville is now. We lived there twelve years. And when we left there, we went to Collinsville. We lived there awhile. Then we moved down to Oowella. Lived there awhile. Then we left there. And moved over here to Turkey Hollow. That was my mother's allotment.

EARLY DAY CONDITIONS AND CHANGES

(Yeah. Well what was the country like in those early days?)

Well, when we first come over there—when I first moved in, there wasn't a house between here and Foyil. Only one over there on Dog Creek. Just a log house. Wasn't no roads. Just go through the woods. Same thing here in Bushyhead. There wasn't no buildings here. Just went straight through the woods.

(Did they have the Coo-wee-scoo-wee District Courthouse here then? In this country?)

No I don't hink they did. Where was it located at?

(Well the last one was located at Claremore. But before that it was up on Dog Creek. Just east of a little place called Sequoyah.)

Yeah. (not clear)

(Yeah, I think a place called Sulphur Springs, I believe.)

Really. Well there used to be a courthouse they kept over there around Alluwee up there on the river.

(Yeah. That's right. They had one up there.)

Oh there's been many a change in this country.
