(December 10, 1968. Today I am with Gib Fallin. And eighty-one year old Cherokee of Estella Community, Craig County, Oklahoma. We are at the Bare Timpson all Indian Cemetery. We have purposely come out here to try to record the names of those who are buried here. This cemetery is grown up in weeds and brush and no effort has been made to preserve it as yet. A plat will be made showing that this graveyard and as near as we can determine those who are buried here. So that we might have some record to be on file.) (They were related to the Deal Family too?)

Yeah. Claude Deal. His first wife was a Timpson.

(Yeah)

But he died. And they had three girls.

(Uh-huh. Now lets see, Bare Timpson now who was he?)

I don't remember. Don't remember I think he was the old man.

He was age 69 years then.

(Uh-huh. Now Betsie Buzzard she's buried here too huh?)

That's the way that reads.

(Yeah. Yeah and Betsie Buz--)

She died in June 18, 1899. She was seventy-one years old.

(Yeah)

(Yeah)

Now that's funny they have them both on the same--

(Yes it is.)

Reckon that was his wife?

(Well it seems that way.)

Corse it seems that way to me too. I think that's be his wife.

(Yeah)

Them there rocks there ain't got much on them. This here rock here is my grandfather.
