(Uh-huh)

But I don't know what it's for.

(Yeah)

And I go out here on this hill I can see lot of other things. I help her gather these things.

(Uh-huh)

She take me with hereverywhere till I got so big, you know. She take me with her. And when she go out and look for medicine. I seen these sticks there for one. She say, "Why don't you get that kind."

(Yeáh)

Show me one. I'd get it. And first thing I know she send me off by myself.

She told me go get this kind sort of like these we get over here. So I go

out and get it for her. I don't know just how did with it. I'd bring it

back to her.

(Hum)

And I asked her, "Is this is?" Well I have to listen close to understand what they're saying in Cherokee. "Course after you catch on it, it's just like our language. It goes on and on.

(But the eastern Cherokee is different.)

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They said that's--that's regular Cherokee language. What the easterns talks now. This here is new. I don't know how.

(Yeah)

But it's not regular,

(Well don't you think, Bert, they had different stuff in this country.)
Probably so.

(Than what they had over there. So they had maybe to call it different name
