In that show storm of winter of 1886 deer could almost be caught with hands. He had observed the change in weather condition thruth years.

He remembers when Indians used to visit one another, in specially when someone was sick. They would imild a fire out in the yard and sit around all night.

de speaks of the wickenness in the world, and talks of his life philosophy.

He remembers in his very carty lays when additions add saft at the saft springs at Salina.

He mentions the wickliff boys in and their rather, and knew them. Says they were good people, but whiteman made the into outlaws.
