took care of ourselves. We were about 8-something like 8--along in there somewhere. Not quite 8. It wasn't getting cold yet, either. It was in the fall--not too late either. It must have been in about November. You know how November is? It was just before Christmas. I mean it was after Christmas because it was cold or it would have been cold, you know, because none of us--it must have been November--along in there--because, see, September is when we went back to school. (Did you speak English when you went to school?)

Well that's what I was telling you. I learned all these things, these two homes and my dad used to talk English. I told you his father was a Frenchman and his mother was full-blood Indian. See?

(Of Towa tribe?)

Yeah. No yeah--I think--I think she was and then he married a Iowa full-blood and that's how come I'm full-blood, see.

(You're, enrolled as an Iowa?)

## ALLOTMENT OF LAND

Yeah, I'm enrolled as an Iowa, and that's the way I was enrolled over here.

But I was born in 19--18--19--1893. And they were allotted in 1892. I
missed it. I didn't get in it. They were allotted in 1892. I missed it,
