You've seen them I guess?

(No-- I'm sorta dumb about farm things.)

Well, that's what they call a "Go-devil." It's a sled, but it's got a disc in the back. You could switch them discs on either side. If you want to throw your dirt out, take one of the discs out and put it on this side, so the blade be out this way. So you take your grain--you're going right there and--them discs--you're going close to that grain and throw that dirt out and throw that grass--dig it up thataway.

(Just go between the rows of the corn?)

Yeah, just like that. And the grain--crop--be right there. And the discs be right down there like that, and throw the dirt up. Clean all that grass out that away. After you get it all that green grass, let it dry, that grass. Go back and turn right around and turn your--tear up your plow, put it back like it be--like it was set before. Just switch them back-(Just switch those discs back?)

Switch them back, yeah, just back, and cover your dirt thataway.

(And just pile--throw the dirt up against the plants?)

(Would you have a horse hitched to the Go-Devil?)

Oh, yeah.

(Is one horse enough?)

Two.

(Then your rows have to be far enough apart for two horses--?)

Oh, it don't have to be that far apart. The middle,-they walk in the middle, you know--every other row--team. Suppose the corn be right there-crop.

There be another--team be walking in the middle-
(Would you have to do this more than one time during the season?):
