And Blue Foreman. Oh, that Blue Foreman!

Blue Foreman, he grew up out there at Tahlequah.

(Son: What's that guy's--them outlaw's name. That man used to be so onery as not a (not clear) over there at (not clear).)

Kenny Davis.

KENNY DAVIS WAS AN OUTLAW - OTHER OUTLAWS AND INCIDENTS

He was from down there. He was an outlaw too. Uncle Manuels told me. One time he said "If I catch you with him I'm gonna shoot." And one time we was out to Uncle Manuels-he lived out there close to Barnard. And the girls went to school at the Seminary. And we'd have a vacation trip. And we'd go out to the home. You know. We went to a singing. (Not clear) We was in Barton's home. Susie, oh what is her-she's been married two or
