You remember (inaudible) sixteen. ** **

(Sixteen,)

Sixteen towards us here.

(Well, there's just a little marble stone there. And it just has'
J.F. on it.)

Mrs. Longtail: "That's Fritz."

(Fritz?)

Mrs. Longtail: "Yeah uh-you know--Joe Fritz."

Yeah, I thought that was kinda back this way, somewhere. Well, there was some grave right over here toward this corner.

(Well, I don't find anything there.)
