(You mean, you just ignored the Indians that were there?)

Well, we didn't know of any tribe of Indians, so we was just traveling through.

(But, I mean--and I imagine most of these trips were on that order, 'bout ever summer round that time. Most Osage families took trips and they took a large company of people with them.)

Yes, they did.
