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- 1. A hairball from the stomach of a buffalo.
- 2. A buffalo tail, or hair from the tail, with hide, folded over a fan made of feathers from a bird called pape. In Kiowa. These were probably the tail feathers of a redshafted flicker. They were rather short feathers, sharp-pointed, black on the ends, and the main part of the feather was orange and red.
- 3. Fan used when singing while doctoring. This was also a rattle. It was made of:
 - a. Tips of buffalo hoofs, which made the rattle sound.
 - b. Buffalo hair, plaited.
 - c. Buffalo tail. I think the fan was constructed arround this buffalo tail--other items fastened to it.
 - d. Many feathers I could not identify (they looked old).
 - e. A small buckskin sack containing ground red paint.
- 4. Wad of buffalo hair.
- 5. A bell.
- 6. Sweetgrass.
