(Mrs. McDaniels: It doesn't belong to it. It just went with this--)

(Is that that otter fur (hair wraps)?)

--that's a beaver skin.

(It is? Oh, it's really pretty. What kind of feathers are these little ones right here?)

How you call this kind of bird? Redbird.

(Mrs. McDaniels: Redbird.)

Red bird's feathers. (Speaks Kiowa)

(I should know these bird feathers but I don't. And I ought to know what these feathers here are but I just don't know my birds well enough.)
