(I imagine he might have moved it for many reasons you know, from there-up there, to down here. He didn't say why they moved it but, he said it was up there by Keen Ridges on that creek. And they moved it down there where Patterson's is.) Mr. Patterson used to talk about the old Indians, you know, when he was living. He was really good. (He was an old blacksmith wasn't he?) Uh-huh. He had--his name was honoseoch (Indian name) (Oh, the Indians gave him a name huh?) Give him name. They give all of 'em names 'round here. (Oh, all these white persons that were associated with 'em.) Um-huh. (Talking about Mr. -- old man Dodson. What did they call him?) I don't know what they called him. (This Mr. Dodson was an old person that -- he must have been here a long time, ⊡ain't he?) We just goin' off this baby board. We ain't through with it. '(We'll go back though.

Huh?

(We can go back)

Well. Well, what was Mr. Dodson's name. I just can't remember right now.

(But anyway. They had more--less, names for--they had to give em some kind a name,
