THE DRUM CAME WITH PONCAS. - SOLDIER DANCE

(Back in the--back--did your folks ever tell you about these drums here that came around or they say, just like Poncas when they left Omahas here. Have they ever talked to you, about that very much?)

Well, seem like this drum that came from Omahas is that Soldier Dance.

(Oh.)

That come about along in '20--'22, about along in there because they dance-- Soldier Dance and my dad and Mrs. Wareshe took that up and they had Soldier Dance, and they invited lot of Osages and they hold dances down there in that roundhouse. About 1922.

(Was that--the women, kind of more or less, participated, didn't they?)

Oh, yeah, that's more for womens there. But this war dance drum, I guess that come way back there, Kaws, I guess, way I understood. I don't know too much about that one, but I know back in '22, '23, '24, we were all
