Yeah. ('Course you killed lots of what you ate.) We always took two wagons. Each family had two wagons. (Yeah) That's all the (not clear). We had. (Yeah) (Not clear) (Uh-huh) (Not clear.) Take your hay with you, in the wagon. Two sheets inside. (Yeah) And two wagon sheets. One on each side. The side boards raise them up. (Yeah) About you had. (Uh-huh) What you need in there. On that sheet covers up. (Well) They hung it out at night on that rope. (Yeah) Sleep at night. Get up early in the morning. Put it back in the wagon and cover it up. (Well) That's way we done. TOWNS BETWEEN WELCH AND OSAGE COUNTRY- OOLAGAH, SKIATOOK, TALALA, AND GROVE (Where there any towns between here and the Osage country in those days?) Yeah. There's was Oolagah, and another town there-- Old Man Rogers used to run down, there. (Skiatook?)
