You take this nigger question here. They have to work and work hard.

(Yeah.)

And now you take kids raised in town, going to school; they don't know nothing about work.

(No, they don't know any. Why you can't hardly hire anybody anymore to do anything.)

You can't hire anybody. If you did hire anybody, they can't do nothing because they don't know how.

(No, it would be pitiful if we'd have another depression like we had way back yonder in 1920. All these young people they wouldn't know how to get out and do a day's work.)

If you turn--you know, when we was fourteen or fifteen, we was pretty competent to take care of ourselves. Now you can take kids in this town along about that age, and they couldn't take care of themselves to save their life. Because they don't know how to do nothing.

(We're in kind of a bad situation, right now.)

That's right. Now, when you get to talking about the Indians in Arizona and New Mexico and appropriating money to build homes, you know what they done with them homes. They put the goats in there. (Laughter.) They live mostly on the goats, you know. But I think that is a funny thing. (It is.)

Because it is the nature of them.

(That's right.)

They have to have somebody to distribute this money, a go-between. And that go-between is the man that gets the money. They may get a little of it, but they don't get very much.

(No. I have often wondered just how they figured these things out where the Indian doesn't get anything.)
