But they got it figured out.

(Sure they have,)

It is a sight to be out there and see them little girls out there herding them goats out there. (Laughter.) Them men don't do any work. (No, they don't.)

Me and one of my nephews down there at Anadarko, they had something down there. They had a rodeo-picnic and the town was jammed up full of people. These Indians were sleeping on them little cots. They got them little old cots give to them, I guess. Maybe rented 'em or just let 'em sleep on 'em. We were driving around over the town. Saw an old Indian woman out there swinging an axe and the old man was laying over there under big elm tree on a cot asleep. (Laughter.) Beat anything I ever saw in my life. That's the way it was. (Sentence not clear.) Now if one Indian likes you, the whole tribe does. It is like a pact. They all like you. If one hates you, they all hate you. That doesn't exist among white men.

(No, it doesn't. It is a hard thing to believe but it sure does work out that way.)

Another thing about Indians, they are pretty truthful and you seldom find one of them who is a thief. But there are thieves among them.

(That's right.)

And--
