(Well in those early days then this was a farming community or cattle raising community?)

Farming and Oil.

(And oil.)

Yeah. When they struck oil in here that's when that town was booming. That was back in, oh I'd say 1907 till 1910. I started school there in 1907, I believe. Started school.

(Well, 1907.)
