(Probably.)

They wanted me to go ahead with it so I did.

(Well, I think that's (unclear).)

Of course, Randy and all of them was to come over here and different tribes comes in. They have costume dance. (words not clear) and we had that, last summer, in June. Try to have it every year in June, first week in June.

ANNUAL POW WOW - DANCES

(Where do you have your Pow-wow?)

Oh, about a mile and half east of here. It's on my brother's place, one give to my son, was on his place there. Mile and a half east, from this corner up here, mile and half east. Yeah we have one in September there, just a (word not clear) came up that time.

(Yes.)

'Course we have quite a bunch of Indians around Wichita. Comes in here different tribes, Commanches, namé one and others.

(Well that's what makes it nice.)

Yeah. Some of the fellars are what you call champion dancers. They go to all these big dances. They have Tulsa now, they have several pow-wows there. They got a regular pow-wow club down there. They have out them to the armory. Now they have dances there pretty often. Of course after I got crippled up its hard for me to get around so I don't go too much. (Oh yes, of course.)

I go over there and I did for a while go over to White Oak. Over there,

I thought probably this summer, if I feel better, I'd try to go to Green

Corn dances along in July or August.

(Yeah. I know Randy was telling me they have their bread dance in April,
