KIOWA CAPTIVE, BOIN-EDAL

Now I will go on to the death of N-jegoty--was one of the stoies. I will tell of one incident that's on record in the year 1835, the Kiowa calendar summer, 1935 (sic) known as the "Cat-tail-Rush Sun Dance" after the recovering of the Taime. The Sun Dance was held on south bank of the north Canadian River where many rushes grew. If you look at the sketch of Medicine Lodge and the box above represents the Taime, or rawhide box. Real ~~was~~ after the Sun Dance, the Kiowas form an expedition war party and went way down south Texas along the Gulf Coast. A few miles from the Gulf of Mexico, they made a raid on a little settlement and captured a young German boy they called Boin-edal--means "Big Blond". He was still living in 1907. I've personally known Mr. Boin-edal. It's recorded in the Kiowa calendar because he was a Taime. Only record made year--winter--Bull Tail was killed by the Mexicans. Well, I think we better stop here.
