No better plan suggests itself to me than appealing directly to the Wardons and Superintendents of the institutions You would do se quite a service if you will have the resolution herein, and my letter read and interpreted to those unfortunates who are confined in your prison in order that they may understand that it is nadessary for them to select some reliable person to assist them in the selection of their allotrents and the collection of money that will be due them under the Treation. It is likely that some of them have already given power of attorney to irresponsible parties, who will make away with their inheritance. It was the purpose of Council in passing this resolution, to protect them against this. Please do what you can to inform them in order that their right be protected during their confinement, and greatly oblige. 产图,一型 Yours truly.
