PETITION FOR THE SALE OF INHERITED LANDS

(Full Blood)

In the matter of the conveyance of inherited lands of Levina Johnson and Emeline Wright, full blood Choctaw Indians.

COMES NOW Levina Johnson and Emeline Wright and show to the COURT that they are members of the Choctaw Tribe of Indians, and are duly enrolled upon the rolls of citizenship, of the Five Civilized Tribes approved by the Secretary of the Interior as Full Blood Indians of said Tribe, and their ages as shown by said Rolls are 56 and 35 years, respectively.

That the petitioners are the owners by inheritance of a one-third interest each, in and to the following described lands in Haskell County, State of Oklahoma: SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , NW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 23 T 7 N & R 20 E & NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$ , SW $\frac{1}{4}$  & SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 24 T 8 N & R 20 E & SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 19 T 8 N & R 21 E being a part of the estate of Simon Johnson deceased.

That at the time of the death of the said Simon Johnson deceased, he was a resident of what is now Haskell County, Oklahoma.
