Dear Sir:

Under separate enclosure I am this day forwarding you right of way maps of the Oklahoma Central Railway Co. as follows: from station 5809 plus 50 to station 5946 plus 52, the first being a point on the east line of section 34, township 7 north, range 7 west, the second, a point north of the CRI&PRY where the same intersects with the line of the Oklahoma Central Railway Co., immediately north of the City of Chickasha. The lots in the said City of Chickasha, crossed by the said Oklahoma Central Railway, where indicated are the private property sought to be acquired by the Oklahoma Central Railway Co.

The above described map is drawn on a scale of 400 feet to the inch. The second map is the right of way map of said Oklahoma Central Railway Co., through the City of Chickasha, Ind. Ter., and is drawn on a scale of 100 feet to the inch. Each of these maps are duly certified by the President of the Oklahoma Central Railway Co. and by its Chief Engineer, and are filed with you under the provisions of the Act of Congress of February 28, 1902 and April 26, 1906.

I also enclose copy of map showing the west half of the northeast quarter of the northeast quarter and the east half of the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter of section 11, township 6 north, range 2 west, which land, exclusive of the 2.78 acres of right of way heretofore acquired, the Oklahoma Central Railway Co. desires to acquire as a site for its terminals, machine and repair shops, round houses



POLICY BOND

IN THE UNITED STATES COURT FOR THE SOUTHERN JUDICIAL DISTRICT OF THE INDIAN TERRITORY, SITTING AT PURCELL.

In the matter of the application of the Oklahoma Central Railway Company for the appointment of referees to determine and appraise the compensation and damages to be paid for land, property and improvements to be appropriated and condemned by the said railway company for right of way, station grounds, and other railway purposes, in the Chickasaw Nation, Indian Territory.

NOTICE.

To Blanche Grayson, Della Grayson, Ben Grayson, father and natural guardian of Blanche Grayson and Della Grayson, the Chickasaw Nation or Tribe of Indians, D. H. Johnston; the Choctaw Nation or Tribe of Indians, Green McCurtain, and all other persons, parties or corporations interested.

You and each of you are hereby notified that the undersigned referees, appointed by the Honorable Joseph T. Dickerson, Judge of the United States Court for the Southern Judicial District of the Indian Territory to determine and appraise all compensation and damages caused by reason of the condemnation and appropriation of the following described lands, to be used by the Oklahoma Central Railway Company for additional right of way and station grounds, in the Chickasaw Nation, Indian Territory, to-wit:-

A tract of land situate in the north half of the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of section ten, township five north, range one east, described as follows: commencing at station thirty hundred, seventy-one plus sixty-four, a point on the center line of the Oklahoma Central Railway Company, as now located, which stands ninety-one feet and six inches south of the northeast corner of said twenty acre tract; thence, south along the west boundary line of said tract, a distance of one hundred, twenty-one feet to a point where a line one hundred feet distant from and parallel with the said center line of said railway intersects with the said west boundary line of the said twenty acre tract, the point of beginning; thence south along said west boundary line of said tract, a distance of sixty and five-tenths feet; thence, on a course south fifty-seven degrees and nine minutes east, a distance of three hundred, sixty-four feet more or less; thence, on a course north thirty-two degrees and fifty-one minutes east, a distance of fifty feet; thence, on a course south fifty-seven degrees and nine minutes east, a distance of four hundred, and twenty-eight feet, more or less, to an intersection with the said south boundary line of said twenty acre tract; thence, east along the said south boundary line, a distance of ninety-three feet more or less; thence, on a course north fifty-seven degrees and nine minutes west, a distance of three hundred, ninety-seven feet more or less, to the point of beginning, containing ninety-five hundredths acres.

A tract of land situate in the south half of the southeast

quarter of the northeast quarter of section ten, township five north, range one east, described as follows: commencing at station thirty hundred, fifty-six plus nineteen, a point on the center line of the Oklahoma Central Railway, which stands three hundred, eighty-two and five-tenths feet north of the southeast corner of said twenty acre tract; thence south along the east boundary line of said twenty acre tract, a distance of fifty-five feet, more or less to the point where a line fifty feet distant from and parallel with the said center line of said railway intersects the east boundary line of said twenty acre tract, the point of beginning; thence, south along the said east boundary line of said twenty acre tract, a distance of fifty-five feet more or less; thence, in a northerly direction, on a curve with a radius of twenty hundred, ten and eighty hundredths feet to the right, a distance of three hundred, fifteen feet, more or less; thence on a course north fifty-seven degrees and nine minutes west, a distance of three hundred, ninety-five feet, more or less to an intersection with the north boundary line of said twenty acre tract; thence east along the said north boundary line, a distance of ninety-three feet, more or less, to an intersection with a line fifty feet distant from and parallel with the center line of the Oklahoma Central Railway; thence, along said line, on a course south fifty-seven degrees and nine minutes east, a distance of three hundred and twenty feet, more or less; thence, on a curve with a radius of nineteen hundred, sixty and eight tenths feet to the left, a distance of two hundred, eighty-five feet, more or less, to the point of beginning containing seventy-six hundredths acres.

All of which lands described in the preceding paragraph, sought to be appropriated and condemned, owing width and area of right of way and station grounds, are accurately described and shown upon the maps of definite location of right of way and station grounds, and which map is attached to the original petition in this proceedings, marked Exhibit A, and which lands contain a total area of one and seventy-one hundredths (1.71) acres; will meet at the law office of J. P. Sharp, in the city of Purcell, in the Southern Judicial District of the Indian Territory, on the 19 day of May, 1907, at 10 o'clock a.m. on said day, and at said time and place proceed with the assessment of damages and compensation for the appropriation of said lands for the purposes above mentioned, and will adjourn from time to time at said place, and at such other places as may be selected by the undersigned referees, provided their labors are not determined, and until their work in this behalf is completed, at which time and place, and at such other times and places, to which the undersigned referees may adjourn, you and each of you and all persons, parties, corporations, Nations or Tribes of Indians, owning or having any interest in, or title to the above described lands or any part thereof, may appear and be heard.

And you and each of you are hereby notified that the undersigned referees will ascertain and set forth in our report the name or names, person or persons, corporation or corporations, title or titles

and Nation or Nations of Indians to whom such damages, if any, are payable, and the interest of each person, corporation, Tribe or Nation of Indians in the award of damages.



You and each of you are hereby notified that the undersigned, referees heretofore appointed by the Honorable Hosea Townsend, Judge of the United States Court for the Southern District of the Indian Territory, at Ardmore, to appraise and assess the damages done or to be done by reason of the condemnation and appropriation of the lands hereinafter described for and on behalf of the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe Railway Company, will meet at Office of S. J. Blodson in the town of Ardmore, Indian Territory, on the 26 day of October, 1907, at 9 o'clock, A. M., and at said time and place will proceed with the assessment of damages and compensation to be made for the appropriation and condemnation of said lands for the purposes above stated, and will adjourn from time to time provided our labors are not completed, until such labors are completed.

At which time and date, and at such other times and dates to which said referees may adjourn, you and all other persons owning, having or claiming any interest in and to said lands, or any part thereof, may appear and be heard.

You are further notified that upon said occasion to produce evidence of your ownership of, title to, or interest in the lands hereinafter described, and of the character and extent of the damage claimed by you because of the taking and using of said land for railway purposes.
