Interview with Mrs. Joseph Bridges
Alva, Oklahoma.

Mrs. Joseph Bridges was born on February 5, 1871, in Coffee County, Tennessee. On February 21, 1894, she was married to Charles M. Davis, at Burlingame, Kansas. To this union were born two children. For several years Mr. and Mrs. Davis lived in Kansas, then moved to Waynoka and in 1907, to Alva.

Mr. Davis died in 1908. On September 5, 1909, Mrs. Davis was again married; this time to Joseph Bridges. She married Mr. Bridges after coming to Alva.

Mrs. Bridges has served several years as Deputy County Treasurer of Woods County under the following treasurers: T. G. Dyer, Dave Miller, John Prigmore and S. L. Walton and besides being Deputy County Treasurer she has taught several terms of school in Woods County.

Mrs. Bridges has been an active member of nearly every organization in Alva but has had to drop out of all of them because of her poor health. She belonged to the Women's Missionary Society; Women's Christian Temperance Union of
