## Interview with O. V. Burright Guthrie, Oklahoma.

0. W. Burright came to Orlando on April 19, 1889. By the time of the Run he knew where he wanted to go. A man told him of Skeleton Creek and its wonderful bottom land.

He made the run and staked a homestead on Skeleton Creek.

This land looked plenty good to one who had just arrived from Mestern Kansas.

after looking the town over he met a friend who said Mr. Eurright could stay overnight on his lot. The next morning the surveyors were coming along surveying the lots. When this particular part was laid off, Mr. Burright found himself on a lot that had not been staked so he immediately staked it off and sat on it. Today Mr. Burright still owns these pieces of land besides several others. He is in very poor health as the culmination of an active past. His daughter wrote a thesis in A. & M. College at Stillwater and it contains the biography of Mr. Burright. This copy is in the Library at the college.
