Interview with Dr. 4. J. Butts.

I was born in the state of dissouri.

at the opening of the Cherokee Strip, September 16, 1893, I came to Oklahoma and filed on a claim eight miles north of Cherokee. I then went back to lissouri in 1894 and and moved my family down in a covered wagon. We crossed the Medicine River and Salt Fork River.

when I first came down to ok ahoma, I lived in a dug out, but after I went back to Missouri, and came back here. I built a sod house.

I ran the first Post Office, in this county. I kept my claim three years, then moved to Ingersoll, and there practiced medicine. I was one of the first doctors in this part of the county. I drove a horse and buggy.

He did our trading at Kiowa, Kansus and at Uva. I am still practicing medicine at this time.
