Early Day Horse Trading and Racing.

**

I came to the Cherokee Strip from the East and I had five horses, a team and covered wagon. I squatted on a farm but it was a school quarter and I moved over to Mannford, which was in the Creek Nation.

I sold my team and wagon to Indians. I had one running horse and matched a race with the Indians. I beat them and sold the horse for \$1,500.00. They could not manage him, so I bought him back for \$500.00. from John Rule who was a Chief. I traded and ran horses all the way from Cleveland, Pawnee, and Perry. I lived in Cleveland four years then came to Perry, where I still live, and have one horse now.
