Joe Southern 'Interviewer, July 15, 1937

Interview with Anna Ludlow McAlester, Oklahoma.

As to the history of the Reverend Allen Wright home, it was built in 1860. This home was built from material bought and hauled from Fort Smith, Arkansas, and it was constructed by an Englishman named Sparrow who also did the stone and masonry work. This house has three chimneys, five fireplaces and two water cisterns. The chimneys and cisterns were built from native sandstone, gotten near there. The stonework and carpentry are first class.

This house in early days was used as a hotel for travelers from different parts of the world. It has six rooms, two hallways, and one library which is filled with books, dating from 1825 up to 1890, on different subjects and in different languages, 260 books altogether.

This house is well kept. Attached are two pictures of the place, the views having been taken July 15, 1937.
