"COLLECTION"

This stuff was said to have been taken off of a dead Indian near the present site of Sayre about 1860 and contains a pair of leggings made of some kind of hide, no hair on them, perhaps taken by the Indian from some white man; a headpiece with a few feathers in it which looks like it had a tail about a foot long; a beaded belt with all colors of beads; a knife that looks something like a buffalo skinning knife but is badly worn; a pair of moccasins made of skin and badly worn.
