

To Peter Folsom

Choctaw Agency

March 29th 1857

As I shall start to the add

Session of the General Council in a few days I thought this morning best to drop you a few lines. I am little afraid we will not get numbers enough to hold our
council Col Harkins is still opposing the new Constitution and is now wishing to get up a Convention to frame an other Constitution he got the County together that he lives in and made Ah-huk-la-tubba Chairman of the meeting and passed sum resolutions to elect delegates to a Convention, saying the General Council had no right to pass resolutions calling a convention but his County had its
posse more power than the Gen Council.

S. S. W. Folsom write me saying the motto over there with Harkins is Rule or Ruin which I think Ruin will be the end. Col Harkins said in his letter to McKinney ^{of 1856} he will try to stop all the members from going to the Council that he can and McKinney must do the same I am very sorry Col Harkins takes such steps in national affairs the Choctaws all say it is the very steps Greenwood Sefford taken in the old nation I am willing to submit to all that is just and right but I cant submit to the doing of Col Harkins that is in the course he is now pursuing the people in this part of the nation are all quiet and opposed to the course and doings of Col Harkins & he said in his letter he dont want any officer for it

won't be glory enough for him to just
put down the Constitution I don't see
what can be his motive for this.

My Brother Elisha was drowned in
Sankey Creek last Sunday three weeks ago
Mrs Hall is Susan Hall is dead she
died last this day. weak. ago old
uncl Mishutiah got drank and froze
to death his ~~was~~ bones were found in Watson
Lucas field Your family are all
well so far as I know we have had
so much rain I expect your people are
getting on slow farming as well as the rest
of us I have not planted the first hill of
corn yet. I would write you more about weather
and things but I have not time this morning
tell Mr P.P. Pitchlyn what Harkins is at
I would write to him too and will write soon
to him I am doing all I can and will do
all I can to keep peace

I will stop as I have a matter to investi-
gate today between Watson Lucas and the Cherokee
nation there was a horse ^{Cherokee} thief taken up and
turned over to Watson for safe keeping the man
got away from Watson and never was found
dead in Custer Bottom the Cherokee chief
has requested something officially from the Cherokee
nation seems to think the man was killed or
murdered and showing it as to passify the connection
of the man that was found dead

My family are all well
and hope you are still in good health
