Dear father

Rev Cyrus Byrnes
You has just called upon me

cause our infamously Mail Contra-
ctor "Cashiers and discharged

drunk and makes daily &
repeated failures without
any excuse, as things are man-
aged over it is but seldom we
can get even a Paper. I recd one
of your letters written Nov 26th
1857 last mail. No body will
