Dear Sir.

I Recd you letter sum time ago, but did not answer as I was waiting to hear the result of the Convention. I am not fully posted yet as to what they have done, I hear they have fell back to the chief Article in the new Constitution. If the Constitution is a good one I will say hurrah for that but if it is not for the benefit of the nation I will turn my back on it and use all my influence for ~~to~~ to put it back where it come from. I have not seen a copy of it yet but I see the Gov Proclamation Calling the voter of the people on the Constitution on the 4th April next. I think he stoned distributed the Constitution so people could see what they was voting for. I expect there has been much Legislating in the Constitution.

Robt Fair passed here last Thursday morning, on his way home, health genial & good in this country. Gen Cooper has not got back to the nation yet, we ^{have not} heard the news that war to be sent out for the Commission to work by. John P. Luce is at some work

mer in the nation sum pthing he wishes
to affect in regard to the money that
we have to get. I have been told he sent
Col G McCarlton to the Convention to have
sum legislation done in the Constitution so
if there is any thing done wrong in the
Constitution you may know who to speak
it on. I am say it was for the purpose
of keeping the Bay Claims from being
brought up before the Commissioners. If
that be the case there is sum pthing in
the dark, I am not fully posted in the
matter but I am going to work to try
to find the truth of this matter and if
things dont go write them may hard work
to get through with. There is nothing
of interest ~~now~~, the people are all
quiet and executing the laws now if the
new Constitution dont come a difficulty
like we had I think we will get on
smooth on even now I have not seen
Col Peter Folger for sum days, he he
was well the last I heard from him.
I hope this lines will reach you in
good health and doing well
