I have, to enclose copy of compact entered into between the Confederate Indian (the Indians of the Timbered Country) and the Indian Tribes of the Plains, and to congratulate you and other Chiefs upon the successful Mission of Peace to the Indian race spread over the Plains West of the Choctaw & Chickasaw Country. It is understood the Northern Osages, Micmacs and other Bands who have been acting with the North in the present war have also come down in at Cherokee Village and propose to join the Indian League. The unity of the Indian race will enable all to secure their rights, perpetuate their race and assume a position of strength and respectability among the Nations of the Earth. The Delegates including Gen. Rock-morton of Texas will attend the Grand Council at Armstrong Academy on the 10th inst. Allow me to say it is of the greatest importance that you and the Choctaw Delegates be present.
