

Report of the Choctaw Academy and Missionary  
Station in Scott County Kentucky near  
the Blue Springs embracing the quarters  
ending the 31<sup>st</sup> of April and 31<sup>st</sup> of July 1826

In this report reference is made to  
the Report of the 31<sup>st</sup> July last as regards  
the situation of the station its local  
advantages buildings &c with the  
addition of one large stone house <sup>25 by 47</sup>  
erected this summer adjoining ~~the~~  
and constituting a part of the former  
Academy — This building connects  
with the former, house occupied, makes the  
the most convenient Academy in the  
Western Country — it has 10 windows 2  
doors and two fireplaces below stair  
and a large opening of 8 feet into the  
old Academy, — It has one door, <sup>2 fireplaces</sup> and 10  
windows above stairs making an elegant  
lodging rooms. The additional building at this

academy is sufficient admit of an additional No. of 60 or 70 <sup>Students</sup>

Reference is also made to the last report as regards the conduct, improvement, and general deportment of the Choctaw boys - however six were added about the first of May making the total number of 27 - The names and ages of the last six are as follows:
