The Dept. was apprised in the Report made on the 30<sup>th</sup> April as to the buildings and local advantages of this Institution; on that subject I deem it unnecessary to say any thing further than that every thing is in good condition and <sup>that all</sup> necessary provision both for comfort and convenience has been made for this quarter. The students appear to be <sup>are</sup> well contented and making good progress in learning. — We have one class consisting of 5 or 6 Choctaws ~~that~~ who have made considerable progress in Astronomy. Other classes are advancing well in reading, writing Arithmetic grammar Geography Surveying &c. We had an exhibition in June <sup>Last</sup> at which there were at least two thousand spectators. The performance on the part of the students ~~was~~ was very gratifying to the audience &

reflected much honor on the Institution.
