

ous, thrifty man. His house is a respectable looking <sup>framed</sup> frame house, which with the accompanying out building gives his farm a comfortable home-like appearance. This man himself is not entitled to share the annuities of the tribe, <sup>a Musquakie regarded as a member of the tribe</sup> being ~~classed among the Potowatomis~~, but his wife being a Musquakie draws hers, as well as their children.

This man is not another being a Potowatomie, & the nationality of a person among Indians being reckoned from the mother <sup>any interest in the tribe</sup> he is not entitled to either land or annuities, but his wife being a Musquakie with her children are entitled to both.
