

5<sup>th</sup> Mo 1873

Does not get along, it is possible that the creeks are too high for crossing,

27<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> Clear & Warm

Rain last night, visited the school for the Michitas taught by William Hunsbaw

The boys (there being no girls in attendance) are a very wild set in appearance, but one or two wearing any clothing more than a shirt, yet they are progressing finely in their learning. There were 18 boys in attendance, they take their meals at the school but do not lodge there.

28<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> day Rain last night  
Clear & Warm

Returned to the Kiowa Agency, having learned that Lone Wolf was in with a small party of Kiowas, but they had left before I arrived at the agency, expecting to encamp for the night near Apache John's farm, about 12 ~~miles~~ miles from the Agency

29<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> Clear & Pleasant

As the Agent had requested Lone Wolf not to leave camp until near noon so that he could send word to the Kiowa camp, if he

5<sup>th</sup> Mo 1873

Beede should arrive, & not being willing to leave any stone unturned by way of effort to get back to the camp. In the morning in company with

George Conover rode out to Apache John's field, but found that Lone Wolf had left, gone on long before we arrived there, so I returned to the Agency.

In the afternoon John D Miles the Cheyenne Agent came to the Agency bringing Thomas Mistor & Mrs Evans of Philad & Cyrus Beede & Wife, there being a few Comanches in, word was sent to their camp to come in tomorrow to have a council with them

30<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> days Rainy. Went to the school & mill this morning after which attended the council in which Thomas Mistor was principal speaker alluding in his speech to his old age & his long continued labors for the Indians, he stated that over fifty years since he visited the Indians in the South & there were thousands of Indians there, Creeks, Choctaws, Cherokees, Seminoles &c. - now there are <sup>but thousands & millions of white people</sup> no Indians there, he afterward visited the Six Nations at the North, there were the Mohawks
