

1st Mo 1874

Their people are not raiding & it being known where the other Kiowas are it may safely be said that they are not engaged in any misconduct at the present.

6th 3rd day Clear & Pleasant though cold Assisted in issuing the annuities to the Kiowas.

7th 4th day Clear & Pleasant

My ambulance having been pretty thoroughly repaired I got ready to start back to camp, but finally as Kicking Bird thought best not to start as it was so late, it was put off until tomorrow which gave me an opportunity to do up a little writing this evening.

Wrote home No 18

8th 5th Clear & Pleasant

Started for camp. Proceeded as far as the head of one of the branches of Cache Creek, a beautiful spring of pure water, at the foot of a low rocky mountain.

9th 6th Clear & Pleasant

Arrived in camp about 2.0 o'clock.

10th 7th day Clear & Pleasant, Remained in & about camp.

11th 1st day Cloudy & cool.

Last night an infant son of Kiyoni-mi Stumbling Bears daughter died. I was awakened in the night by the lamentations in the lodge & this morning the ^{body} child was buried some distance from camp. The child had been for some time sick, & its death had been expected for some days.
