

2<sup>nd</sup> Mo 1874 — 3<sup>rd</sup> Mo

The office, To day arrived Isaiah Worth's  
Wife on a religious visit to the Agency &  
Indians, They are from Iowa & have been  
away from home some 3 months,

24<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> day Clear & cold, Very unwell

Evening attended the meeting appointed by  
I. Worth in which I believed a few words were  
required of me but though willing to give utter-  
ance to them, yet by not watching the right  
time the meeting closed & I came away burdened

After returning to the Agency the Agent  
said to me "I fully expected to hear thy voice  
& looked at thee expecting to see thee rise" &  
had to acknowledge how it was with me,  
& my unfaithfulness

25<sup>th</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> day Clear Unwell, Worked in the  
Office, Wrote home No 22

26<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup> Cloudy Unwell Kowas Comanches  
in for rations

27<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> Cloudy with some rain, The Strands  
who have been with us for a few day left  
for the Wichita Agency this morning, I wrote  
an article for the Home Journal

28<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> day Cleared off afternoon, Raining  
last night & this morning, Still unwell  
Remained about the shops most of the  
day

3<sup>rd</sup> Mo 1<sup>st</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> day of week Clear Attended  
Meetings @ Evening, Big Sue & several  
other Kowas came in, for their rations

2<sup>nd</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> day Clear Worked in the shop

3<sup>rd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> day Clear Started lone for camp  
traveled all day fast; met a band of  
Comanches, who of course wanted to  
talk, & while thus engaged watched their  
opportunity, of relieving me of both my loads
