14th 1st day Rainy Remained at the Agency
 Pacer the Apache Chief being in Afford
 went out with him to his camp I moved
 my bed into our room, from my ambulance
 & spent the evening in it alone

15th 1st day Cloudy Attended both meetings
 In the afternoon meeting ventured to give utter-
 ence to a few words that had been with me in the
 previous part of the meeting, & have felt satisfied in at-
 tending to what appeared to be my duty in that respect
 Also addressed the Indian children in their
 school,

16th 2nd day Clear Rained last night
 Spent the day at the Agency writing

17th 3rd day Clear & Pleasant, Wrote Home No 25
 P.M. Started back to camp passed through
 the Canon or gap in the mountain, & camped
 on one of the streams at the head of Cache
 Creek

18th 4th day Cloudy but Pleasant, Arrived at
 camp about 1, o'clock P.M. found it
 somewhat enlarged by the coming in of
 other bands of Kiowas, At now appears
 to be well authenticated that the Surveyor
 who was killed up the river a short time
 since, & attributed to Kiowas, was murdered
 by Cheyennes, & it is a little remarkable
 that, while there were three of them together
 two of whom were entirely unarmed that
 when they separated, the one who was
 armed with a Navy Revolver should be
 the one killed, I had learned by the
 Comanches some days since, that they
 supposed he was killed by the Cheyennes
 but the Surveyors themselves are now
 well satisfied that it was done by them, thus
