have to get possession of one & take him to it, & he wanted me to remain at the Agency, for the present & he would go to the camps of the Cheyennes & Comanches <sup>I have a talk with</sup> ~~he would come~~ them, also with Lone Wolf & if it would be safe for me he would come in after me, if not he would let me know I had a very satisfactory talk with him, again urging him to a continuance on the road in which he had been travelling for several years, & though it might seem rough & hard for a while he would find it would become smoother & better & result in great good to him & through him to his people.

In the afternoon some of the Penahshah Tetkhas came in to the Agency, who had after a severe struggle on their part succeeded in breaking away from the main body of the Comanches, & came back to the Agency to avoid the consequences of going on the war path. They with Quort & Quip who escaped with them report the Cheyennes & the ballance of the Comanches are actually on the war path, & determined on bloodshed. They also report that it was Lone Wolf party who captured the military horses at Fort Concho in Texas.

At the Agency. Not well. Kicking Bird called around to bid me "Go - Bye" & went to camp. In writing me in the presence of the Pentahshah Tetkhas to go to camp with him, but again in private telling me that he thought I had better not go.
