On page 39 reference is made to the letter of T. C. B. mentioned in last statement & to be found on page 157 of Quaker among Indians, & the reply to it by the Commissioner (Quaker among Indians page 160) indeed a large part of Chapter VIII. corroborates Statement "A" in the hands of Senator Wilson, except the work in the camp, which of course Agent Haworth had no personal knowledge.

Statement "B" is more fully corroborated in "Life of J. M. Haworth," - given on pages 47, 48, 49, & 50. He mentions the reception of the message from the Commissioner, renewing the demand of the five men - the sending of Thos. C. Battey & Chisholm to the Kiowa camps with his message, gives Lone Wolf's & Kicking Birds replies to Battey, some of Battey's arguments to them & follows all with the following statement; - viz

"The result was that they went on, (Kiowas, to the Agt) & a wide-spread war was averted, for Kicking Bird was the leader of the moderate party among the Kiowas."

Again on page 73 he refers again to the same subject of "sending Battey & Chisholm (for interpreter) to the Kiowa camps to counteract the evil influences that were almost sweeping Kicking Bird as well as Lone Wolf into the Warpath." In Agent Haworth's
