It having been reported to the Comdg Officer that the Brown guard stationed at Dodge City has been behaving in a disorderly manner, Serg Alfred A. Co. 2^d Cavalry and the private guard are hereby relieved from duty at that place and will return to this post without delay. The Quartermaster's Dept will furnish one mule wagon for transportation.

1. In order to enable him to comply with S.O. 95, par 6. c. s. 75. Com. Dept of Mo. Serg Edwin Smith 5th Cavalry, is hereby relieved from duty at this post.

2. A Board of Survey is hereby ordered to convene at this Post at 10 am. to day or as soon thereafter as possible to investigate and fix the responsibility for the loss of one horse and to examine and make recommendation as to the condition of certain horses and to fix the responsibility for the loss of one Co. 2^d Cavalry. Call of which property belonging to the U.S. and for which Sgt W. M. Wallace 5th Cavalry is responsible.

3. The Serge of the Guard is to officiate before and present Serge of the night. The Officer of the Day will see that patrols are made frequently between taps and midnight by the Serge of the Guard. All soldiers men found out of their quarters after taps, except for necessary reasons will be arrested and reported to the Officer of the Day. No loud talking, singing, or other noise will be permitted in Barracks, quarters of Quartermaster, or civilian employees, after taps, nor will any entertainment be given by any except Officers of the Post without special permission from the Post commandant.
