No. 125

I. It having been reported that a large body of Indians are in camp at or near  
Sycamore crossing, Capt T. C. Tupper U.S. Cavalry with his Company will proceed at once and as-  
certain the business of these Indians upon the north side of the Arkansas, also their num-  
ber name of Chiefs if possible, when they are going and when they have been and by whom  
Authority of any they are off their Reservation. They will be told that they must return to  
their country at once. Should they be going West or South Capt Tupper will inform this Office  
without delay of their intentions by telegraph or courier.

Capt Tupper will provide himself with three (3) days rations and the neces-  
sary forage and ammunition. Return will report at once to Capt Tupper to accompany him as  
Detachment.

The Co. M. Dept will furnish one six mule wagon and one ambulance.

II. Leave of Absence for seven (7) days is hereby granted. Asst Surg. W. S.  
Dorman U.S. Army.
