

Lieut. Abbot will be careful in his intercourse with the Indians, treating them with kindness, but firmness, not permitting more than two to enter his camp at the same time. Force will not be used except as a last necessity, and only in case of outrage.

Lieut. Abbot will keep his men well together, and constantly near his wagons.

Interpreter "Romeo" will report to Lieut. Abbot to accompany him on this scout.

Rations and full forage for seven (7) days will be taken.

Lieut. Abbot will cause to be made out on this scout an odometer measurement and compass survey from the intersection of the Camp Supply Road and Bluff Creek to the point where he reaches the Camp Supply Road on his return.

The Quartermaster's Department will furnish one (1) ambulance and three (3) six mule teams as transportation.

II Private James Ingraham D Co 3rd Infantry, now in Hospital at this post will proceed today to Camp Supply D.T. reporting upon his arrival at that post, to his Company Commander for duty.

Rations for three (3) days will be issued to Private Ingraham, to include the 23rd inst.

III. Sergt. C. L. Goats D Co 3rd Infantry, and two privates D Co 6th Cavalry having reported at their Hd. Qrs. in compliance with S.O. No. 185. Hd. Qrs. Camp Supply D.T. will proceed today to Camp Supply D.T. reporting upon arrival to the Commanding Officer of that post.

Rations will be furnished for three (3) days to include the 23rd inst.
