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Road runs up river on North side of syracuse from miles where we know to the left

and cross the Arkansas to the south side digging down the bank for wagons to enter

the river. Camped on the river bank

Crossed the Arkansas opposite the camp to the north side and marched to near Aubreys

station. Woods Grass abundant.

Marched on a road made by hunters to the Arkansas river above Lakin through Cheyenne

pass. The Guide informed me that this pass was the mouth of Bear Creek, left sand

Creek on the left hand heading towards the North West, passed a large pond of clear

water on left of the road between the cheyenne pass and the Arkansas River. Which

is thought to be the water of Bear creek. Found a good camp with plenty wood and

water and grass.

Road continued up the River four miles before reaching permanent Camp, crossed a

flat known as the mouth of two Butte Creek, but no water or Creek visable. Reached

permanent at 11 A.M.

Trails leads up south band with a belt of bluffs on the left a good camping place is

found nearly opposite the town of Sergeant on the A.T. & S. F. R. R. Grass and wood

Sufficient.
