near, and that he would guide them - We went
over and went right in - Moses told Sitting Bull
that there were more Nez Percés coming that the
soldiers had captured Joseph and that we wished to
make friends with the Sioux. Sitting Bull was
~~at the battle himself~~ They shook hands and pledged
friendship - Sitting Bull sympathized with the Nez Percés
Whitshirt and his band came right up to the same
place - After resting five days Sitting Bull ~~sent~~ ^{led}
10 Sioux 9 Nez Percés + 3 Nez Percé women as a scouting
party to go back and see whether the soldiers were
yet in the vicinity - They were out for four
days and found no soldiers - He went to the battle
ground and the Chippewas ^{who lived in log cabins there (at what is now Chiocor)} told us that the soldiers said
there would be no more war and that they left the
day before - We turned round and went back. It took
two days to get back to the Sioux camp - Sitting Bull
was a good guide, knew all the land and the people - He seemed to be almost
their leader too.
